

The Girl with the Emerald Brooch with Jacqueline Creek



1966, Sheffield Wednesday and the FA Cup Final - Documentary screening

In 1966, Sheffield Wednesday reached the FA Cup Final with the youngest team ever to make it to that stage. The city took the team to its heart and over 100,000 supporters applied for tickets and later welcomed the team back home. For the first time, people's memories and experience from that time have been recorded and filmed by young people from the Reporter's Academy who interviewed surviving players, their families, press and fans. The film features untold stories, unseen BBC footage, newspaper and programme articles along with music from 1966.




Code Clubs for 9 - 11 year olds
